The holy bishop stands on a floor similar to rippling water. The background is gilded. The richly elaborate halo behind the man's head is also gilded and embossed. The gilded frame has an ornamental border of four-passes containing a rosette. The corners and center of the stiles are decorated with a figure on a pedestal and holding an attribute. On the back of the panel, on the lower left is a lacquer seal in red wax. On the back of the frame is an

inscription in pencil: 'S Augustin peintre de Sienne / Helbig'.
