Description: An oval alabaster relief depicts St. Luke seated on his symbol, the ox. The man is beardless and wears headgear. On his lap, the evangelist holds an open book to which he points. A lost piece in the right corner is poorly filled. The alabaster is encased in an octagonal wooden frame with hollow moulding and ebony veneer. From the same series, St. Mark is kept in the collection.
