Description: The top arched pax table represents Mary seated before the cross with the

dead body of Christ on her lap. To the left and right of this pietà, respectively,

kneels the patron, a mitred bishop or abbot, in prayerful pose and St.

Dominic with an open book in his right hand. Mary presents both with a red rosary. This is a reference to the rosary prayer when Mary is said to have appeared to St. Dominic in 1208. The scene takes place in a meticulously rendered landscape with flowers, trees, hills and behind them the silhouette of the city of Jerusalem. Mary and Dominic hold a nimbus. The donor wears a mitre and choir cap. The painted enamel is encased in its original gilded brass

frame with an S-shaped handle on the back.
