Description: Charles van Caloen, in half-sight and as a senator with around the neck the Order of St. Gregory the Great and on the chest the Order of Leopold. The right hand clasps his sword, status symbol as a senator. The man is in profile and looking to the right. In front of him is an oratory on which is the coat of arms of the van Caloen family. Behind the person portrayed is a paneling with letter panels behind which is a vast landscape with Loppem Castle. This work forms a counterpart to the portrait of his wife Savina de Gourcy Serainchamps (inv. 00246).
