Origin: The crucified Christ, still clearly Romanesque in influence, comes from a

processional cross. No crown of thorns but a crown as a sign of dignity, referring to Christ as king and victor over death. Breasts and ribs are rendered in fine wavy lines. The enamel-adorned loincloth or *perizonium* comes to the knees. The feet are placed side by side while the eyes are

executed with two drops of blue glass.
