Description: The pyxis is decorated all around with a succession of medaillions each

depicting the bust of an angel. The angels have a nimbus and emerge from clouds. The same decoration occurs on the hinged conical lid. Between the medallions a stylized floral ornament. Dark and light blue, light green, red and white are the colors used. The crowning (cross, flower or bud) is lost. The interior finish is gilded and the bottom is hollow so that taking the host can

be done without difficulty.
